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## 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Medicare Orthotics and3 Prosthetics Patient-Centered Care Act".

4 SEC. 2. INCREASING PROTECTIONS FOR MEDICARE BENE5 FICIARIES RECEIVING ORTHOTIC AND PROS6 THETIC CARE.

7 (a) PROHIBITION ON PAYMENT FOR ITEMS DELIV8 ERED BY DROP SHIPMENT.—Section 1834(h)(1) of the
9 Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1395m(h)(1)) is amended
10 by adding at the end the following new subparagraph:

11 "(I) PROHIBITION ON PAYMENT FOR CER12 TAIN ITEMS FURNISHED USING A DROP SHIP13 MENT.—

14 "(i) IN GENERAL.—No payment may
15 be made under this subsection for an item
16 described in clause (ii) furnished to an in17 dividual via a drop shipment on or after
18 the first day of the first year beginning
19 after the date of the enactment of this sub20 paragraph.

21 "(ii) ITEMS DESCRIBED.—The items
22 described in this clause are orthotics and
23 prosthetics, not including supplies for such
24 orthotics and prosthetics, that are identi25 fied by HCPCS codes for which payment is
26 not made under section 1847.

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1	"(iii) Drop shipment defined.—In
2	this subparagraph, the term 'drop ship-
3	ment' means, with respect to an item de-
4	scribed in clause (ii), the direct shipment
5	of such item to an individual who has not
6	received training or education from a
7	qualified practitioner (as defined in sub-
8	paragraph (F)(iii)) on the fitting and ad-
9	justment, care, and use of such item.".
10	(b) Additional Practitioners Exempt From
11	Competitive Acquisition.—Section 1847(a)(7)(A)(i) of
12	the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. $1395w-3(a)(7)(A)(i)$ )
13	is amended—
14	(1) by inserting ", physical therapist, occupa-
15	tional therapist, orthotist, prosthetist," after "by a
16	physician''; and
17	(2) by striking "the physician's" each place it
18	appears and inserting "such physician's" in each
19	such place.
20	(c) Ensuring Beneficiary Access to Replace-
21	MENT CUSTOM-FITTED ORTHOTICS AND CUSTOM-FAB-
22	RICATED ORTHOTIC DEVICES.—Section 1834(h)(1)(G) of
23	the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. $1395m(h)(1)(G)$ ) is
24	amended—

(1) in the heading, by inserting ", CUSTOM FITTED ORTHOTICS, CUSTOM-FABRICATED
 ORTHOTICS," after "REPLACEMENT OF PROSTHETIC
 DEVICES"; and

5 (2) in clause (i), by inserting "replacement of
6 custom-fitted orthotics, replacement of items of cus7 tom-fabricated orthotics described in subparagraph
8 (F)(ii)," after "which are artificial limbs,".

9 (d) REGULATIONS.—Not later than 1 year after the 10 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Health 11 and Human Services shall promulgate final regulations to 12 implement the amendments made by this section.
